

# CHRISTMAS PILLOWS

## FATHER CHRISTMAS

### Supplies:

- 2/3 Yard Whispering Pines red check, B0386-R
- Scraps of Illusions V0188-Z for face, white print for mustache and beard, Whispering Pines Beige Check B0386-E for clothing trim, and Backyard Friends and Neighbors B1079-G green print for gloves
- Ultra Hold Heat n' Bond fusible web
- Delta Ceramcoat® paints:

Fleshtone, Black, Liberty Blue, Barn Red, and Butter Cream

- 4 buttons, 1" wide
- Itoya marking pen (black) or other fine-tip fabric pen
- Scrap of twine
- Polyfil® stuffing
- Unbleached linen thread
- Spray matte sealer

### Instructions: (1/4" seam allowance throughout)

1. Trace face onto the paper side of the fusible bond. Trace mustache, beard, eyebrows, clothing trim pieces, and gloves and fuse, leaving space between the pieces. Fuse to the wrong side of the appropriate fabrics, and cut out all the pieces.
2. Trace the facial features onto the muslin and set aside.
3. Tape the pieces of the Santa Body together and cut out the fabric. With the right sides together, stitch around the body, leaving an opening at the bottom. Trim the seam allowance to 1/8" and turn the body right side out. Press the body and fuse the face to the body.

4. Paint the face as indicated in the diagram. Note: to dry brush, use a stiff, small brush and dip into the Barn Red. Remove most of the paint by rubbing the brush on a paper towel. When the effect begins to look quite powdery, blush the cheeks, nose, and lip area.
5. Fuse the beard, mustache, and eyebrows in place and use the Itoya pen to outline each of the three pieces. Spray lightly with a matte sealer. Fuse the clothing trim and gloves onto the doll.
6. Stuff the doll firmly, but use your free hand to flatten the body as you work. Stitch the opening closed.
7. Thread the linen into the button holes, tie a bow and glue down the front of the doll. Tie a piece of twine in a bow and glue to the top of the hat.

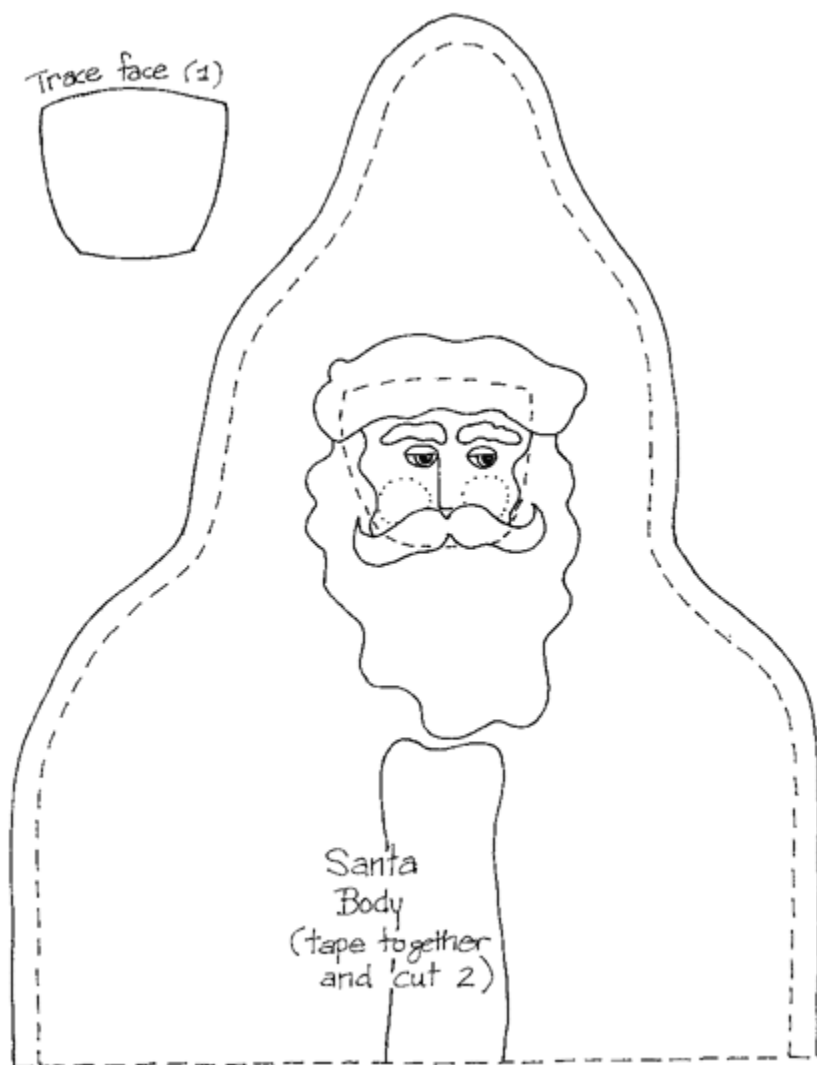

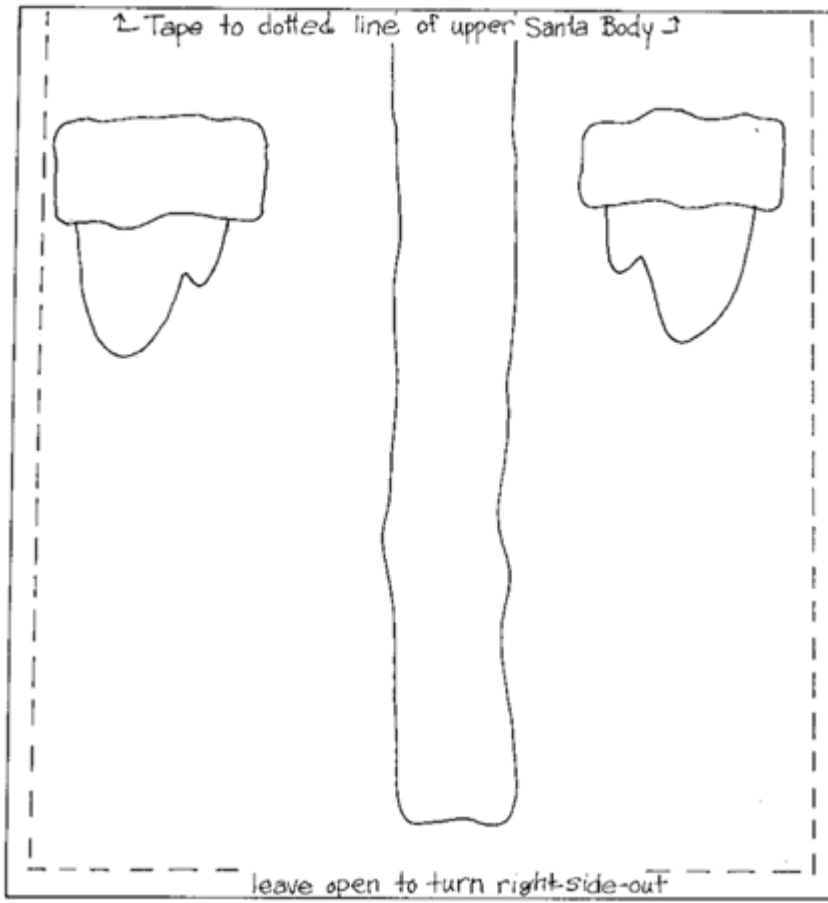
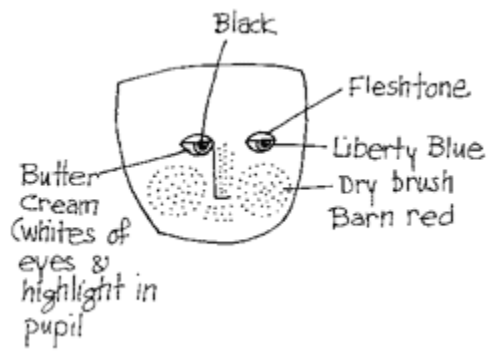

# CHRISTMAS PILLOWS

## ANGEL

### Supplies:

- 1/6 Yard of Textures V0184-M for bottom half of doll body
- 1/6 Yard of Textures V0183-F for top half of doll body
- 1/6 Yard of Textures V0188-T for wings
- Polyfil® stuffing
- Scrap of muslin for head
- 5" wide triple bow of brown chiffon ribbon with gold edges (1 1/2" wide ribbon)
- Pre-made, gathered ribbon rose
- Two ribbon leaves
- 1 1/4" wide double-face satin bow from 1/4" wide ribbon
- 2/3 Yard strip of dark, fake fur
- 2/3 Yard of gold upholstery trim
- Delta Ceramcoat® paints:

Santa's Flesh, Barn Red, Burnt Umber

- Itoya marking pen or any black fine-tip fabric marker
- Matte spray sealer

### Instructions:

1. Place the head piece and the doll body with the right sides together, matching the straight edges, and stitch. Press the seams toward the body. Repeat for the other pieces.
2. Place the bottom and top pieces with the right sides together, matching the straight edges, and stitch them. Press open and repeat for other two pieces, leaving a 3" opening in the middle of the seam.

3. Place the head piece and the doll body with the right sides together, matching the straight edges, and stitch. Press the seams toward the body. Repeat for the other pieces.
4. Place the body pieces with the right sides together and stitch around the entire body.
5. Paint the head, following the diagram. Draw the facial details with the Itoya pen and spray lightly with the matte spray sealer. See Father Christmas Step 4 regarding the dry brush technique.
6. Glue the fur and trim around the center of the doll, covering the center seam. Begin gluing at the back of the doll.
7. Place the wings with the right side together and stitch around them, leaving an opening at the bottom for turning. Trim the seam allowance to 1/8", clip the curves, and turn right side out. Press the wings and topstitch, following the pattern for a guide.
8. Stuff the wings carefully, keeping them flat, and stitch the bottom opening closed. Stitch or glue the wings to the back of the angel and glue on the bow with the flower and leaves in the center. Glue the small bow under the chin.

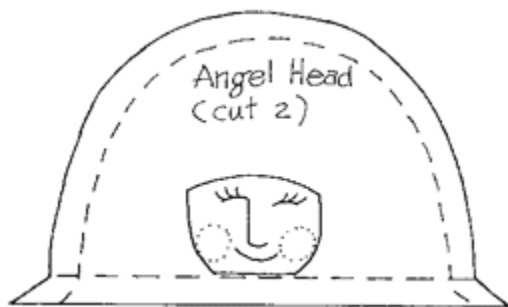
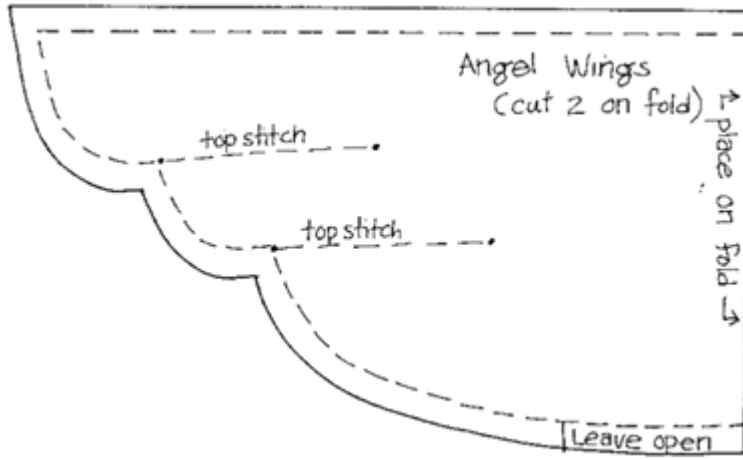

# CHRISTMAS PILLOWS

## SNOWMAN

### Supplies:

- 1/3 Yard of Illusions V0189-Z white-on-white print fabric
- Scraps of fabric for scarf and hat (We used Magic of Christmas V7269-F for hat and Christmas Village V7051-R for hat)
- Scraps of trim for hat
- 1 Small tassel to match hat
- Delta Ceramcoat® paints:

Barn Red, Black

- Scrap of orange felt for nose
- Polyfil® stuffing
- Gold glitter spray (optional)

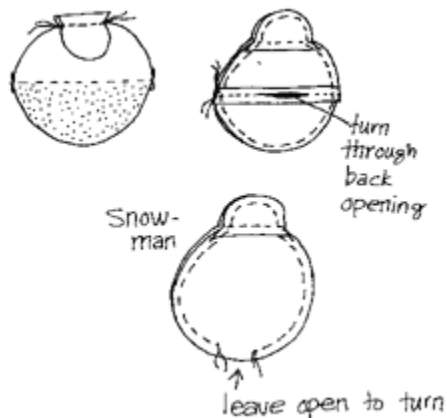
### Instructions: (1/4" seam allowance throughout)

1. Place the head piece and the doll body with the right sides together, matching the straight edges, and stitch. Press the seams toward the body. Repeat for the other pieces.
2. Place the body pieces with the right sides together and stitch around the entire body. Leave a 3" opening at the bottom for turning.
3. Fold the triangular nose piece in half and stitch the seam. Trim the seam allowance, turn the piece right side out and stuff. Use a needle and thread to gather very close to the open edge, and pull to gather.
4. Dry brush the cheeks (See Father Christmas Step 4) with Barn Red and use the end of the paint brush handle (a small one) to dot

the eyes and mouth with the black paint. Let the paint dry thoroughly.

5. Stitch the nose to the center of the face.
6. Tear a piece of fabric 27 1/2" x 2" for the scarf. Fringe the sides and ends a little. Tie around the neck with the knot at the left side of the head, having the ends uneven in length. Tack them in place with a tiny bit of hot glue.
7. Cut a piece of fabric 6 3/4" x 4 1/4" for the hat. Fold in half and stitch the 4 1/4" edge. Turn right side out and gather one end, about 1/2" from the edge. Turn the raw edges inside the hat, and before you knot the threads, insert the loop end of the tassel. Stitch or glue it in place. Place the hat on the snowman's head, glue in place, and glue the trim to cover the raw edges. With the hot glue gun, tack the cap so the tassel flops over to the right side of the head.
8. Spray with a little gold glitter spray if you wish.

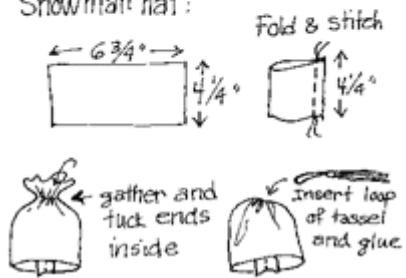
